Dental Care—it's a family affair!



One, two, three little sisters troop aboard the PRASAD CDHP mobile dental clinic: Jasmin, 9 ¹/₂; Jacquelyn, 8 ¹/₂; and Ashley, 6. Their youngest sister, Allyson, gets a ride in her mother's arms.

Their parents, Becky and Francisco, have been bringing their children to PRASAD CDHP since 2003.

But Allyson is just 16 months old – Does she really need dental care when she's that young? The answer is, "Yes." According to the American Dental Association, "... just because babies don't have any visible teeth, doesn't mean they won't get cavities."

Dr. Cecilia Escarra, PRASAD CDHP's Program Administrator explains, "An infant's teeth are susceptible to decay as soon as they begin to emerge. Dental health education for the parents of infants and toddlers is important to promote healthy eating patterns, and to minimize caries risk."

Allyson's teeth - all eight of them - are fine, but Becky said, "I just want her to get used to it. The sooner you start, the sooner they'll get in the habit of taking care of their teeth."

Becky knows because her kids have been patients of PRASAD CDHP since Jasmin was just four years old.

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Continuity of Care

Our commitment to our patients and community:

"In the USA, it is hard for many low-income families to find a "dental home," where their children can receive regular preventive care and emergency treatment. Some dental programs offer only preventive visits and referrals. This leaves families to try to find a dentist for continuity of care.

PRASAD CDHP coordinates with schools and local organizations to provide that ongoing preventive and restorative dental care and to be there for our patients year-round."

PRASAD CDHP Earns Harris Award!

PRASAD Children's Dental Health Program (PRASAD CDHP) has earned the 2012 Samuel D. Harris Children's Dental Health Grant from the American Dental Association Foundation (ADAF).

The grant will sponsor the project, "GET A SMILE! PASS IT ON TO YOUR BABY." The goals of this

project are to promote oral health education among pregnant women and to reduce caries incidences in infants and toddlers.

Dr. Samuel Harris was a noted pediatric dentist and philanthropist who created an endowment fund for prevention of childhood dental disease. Annually, the ADAF awards the Samuel Harris Children's Dental Health Grant to selected non-profit organizations that sponsor education programs to help reduce the incidence of early childhood caries.
